Hockey Players Code of Conduct

Rights:

Hockey players play the game for a variety of reasons and have many expectations. Whether it's to attain a personal goal, a higher level of competition or simply for the pure fun and excitement of the sport. Parents and Coaches hold the keys in player's choices to participate.

Millbrook & District Minor Hockey Players have the right to:

Have fun.

Have consistent leadership through qualified coaching.

Participate in a safe and healthy environment, free of harassment and abuse.

Have the opportunity to participate regardless of ability or income level.

An equal opportunity to strive for success.

Be treated with dignity and respect by all involved.

All opportunities to improve their skills and abilities.

Code of Conduct:

Players will always respect coaches, officials, opponents and team members.

Players will remember that coaches and officials are there to help them.

Players will accept the decisions of coaches and officials with respect.

Players will not be critical and negative towards others.

Players will play the game within the rules to the best of their ability.

Players will strive to achieve a true team spirit by demonstrating a high level of sportsmanship and self-discipline.

Players will resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility and violence.

Players will remember that when traveling, they are representing Millbrook & District Minor Hockey Association and will act in an acceptable manner with pride and dignity, on and off the ice.

Responsibilities:

Players are responsible for leaving dressing rooms, hotel rooms, buses, etc. in a clean and orderly condition.

Players are responsible for their arrival to games and practices in sufficient time for dressing, warm-up, and pre-ice instructions. It is recommended they be ready to go on the ice 15 minutes prior to scheduled times.

Players have a responsibility to their team. Reliable attendance is essential to skill and team development. Players are expected to attend as many practices and games as possible. In the event a player cannot make the scheduled ice-time, it is their responsibility to give the coach as much notice as possible.

It is recommended that all players familiarize themselves with the MDMHA Discipline Guidelines.

It is the players' responsibility to supply a medical certificate from a physician, authorizing the players' return to MDMHA activities when requested to do so by a team or association official.

It is the players' responsibility to request, in writing, if they desire to play in a different division than the one they were registered in.

Players are responsible for wearing a full set of approved equipment each time they are on the ice.

Players, Parents, Guardians are responsible for reading, ensuring they understand (ask if unsure), and returning their signed copy of the Players Code of Conduct.
